Did you know there are a lot of koalas in the Port Stephens area? Take a drive over to have lunch at the **Cheeky Dog** (right next to **Bannisters**) at **Soldiers Point**. It's a timely excuse for a very enjoyable meal and a reason to go koala hunting. Painted on the roads are signs advertising koalas in the area. It is a warning to motorists to keep an eye out for them. With kids in tow, stop the car and get out to look up into the trees. You will see them more often than you might think.

On our most recent stay, while walking up **Mt Tomaree**, we saw a whale and her calf who had been resting overnight in the bay. We also saw some tawny frogmouths sitting on a branch just a couple of metres from the path. Once before, we saw a koala at the top of Mt Tomaree - so, keep an eye out for the real locals while you stay at API's Tidemark. **AP**i
