If you have travelled extensively, you will know that areas, such as Port Stephens, are truly world class. The beaches and vistas are amongst the best in the world. Add this natural beauty to the regular sight of pods of dolphins and passing whales, often visible from the shore, and it's easily understandable why the area, pre-COVID, was high on the list for inbound visitors to Australia.

If you have travelled overseas, you will have noticed the coffee is not a patch on what is served here, and the produce is well... unfortunately often a little disappointing compared to what is available in Australia.

Taking a glass-half-full approach, one of the best things that came about as a result of COVID has been Australians re-discovering how good holidaying in Australia, in our own backyard is.

Shoal Bay is the jewel-in-the-crown within the Port Stephens area. Local restaurants offering a wide range of good cuisines, and all within a 3-to-4-minute level-walk along the edge of the bay.

There are adventure activities available both within the bay and surrounds. Stand-up Paddle (SUP) boards can be hired right on the beach, as can small catamarans. Snorkelling is a perennial favourite as the area is famous for its soft corals. Keen anglers can be found on the jetty and at Tomaree Point every day of the year. Of course, there are also charters available and tinnies to hire from the Marina in Nelson Bay as well.

There are wineries to visit and craft beer brewing sampling facilities. Be warned, the meal sizes at Murray's Brewery are substantial.


